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1.0 INTRODUCTION

Rt. Hon Speaker and Hon. Members,


The National Library (Amendment) Bill, 2024 was read for the first time on Tuesday 9th April, 2024 and in accordance with Rule 129(1) of the Rules of Procedure of the 11th Parliament of the Republic of Uganda, was referred to the Sectoral Committee on Education and Sports for scrutiny.

The Committee scrutinized the Bill in accordance with Rule 129(2) of the Rules of Procedure and hereby reports to this house in accordance with Rule 130(2) of the same Rules.



2.0 POLICY AND PRINCIPLES OF THE BILL


The policy behind the Bill is to give effect to the Government Policy for Rationalization of Government Agencies and Public Expenditure (RAPEX) which was adopted by the Cabinet on 22nd February 2021.



3.0 DEFECTS IN THE EXISTING LAW

The Bill states the defects in the existing law as follows:

The Constitution establishes a definite number of Government agencies, including constitutional commissions, authorities, boards, local councils and other statutory bodies. These were established to perform certain specified constitutional functions. Over the years, however, there has been a proliferation of agencies established by Acts of Parliament, Executive Orders and administrative arrangements. Whereas most of the agencies are necessary due to the critical nature of the functions they perform, Government has established that a certain limited number of agencies were established without due consideration to the aspects of institutional harmony, functional duplications, overlaps and affordability. Government has also established that some agencies have served the purpose for which they were established. The mandate of a few other agencies has been overtaken by events. Such agencies need to be rationalized.



More importantly, the proliferation of agencies has created mandate overlaps and jurisdictional ambiguities among the agencies. Additionally, the high cost of administering the agencies has drained the national treasury at the expense of effective service delivery. This has overstretched the capacity of Government to sustain them. Government has also established that the generous salary structures of the agencies has created salary disparities between employees of the agencies and public officers in the traditional civil service leading to demotivation of human resources in the mainstream public service.

4.0 OBJECT OF THE BILL

The main objective of this Act is to give effect to the Government Policy for Rationalization of Government Agencies and Public Expenditure adopted by the cabinet on 22nd February, 2021 and contained in Cabinet Minute No. 43(CT 2021).

5.0 METHODOLOGY

During the process of considering the Bill, the committee:

a) met and held discussions with the following stakeholders:

- (i) The Ministry of Education and Sports;
- (ii) The National Library.

b) reviewed the following documents:

- I. The Constitution of the Republic of Uganda, 1995 (as amended);
- II. The National Library Act, 2003;
- III. Written memoranda from National Library.

6.0 BACKGROUND TO NATIONAL LIBRARY OF UGANDA


The National Library of Uganda established by the National Library Act, 2003, replaced the Public Libraries Board established by the Public Libraries Act, 1964. National Library of Uganda is responsible for standards, guidelines,

and advocacy for libraries and distributes over 30,000 books to over 50 public libraries and to community libraries across Uganda. National Library of Uganda has an annual collection of over 1500 legal deposit materials by Ugandan writers and currently employs 16 staff.

The functions of the board are to establish, manage and maintain the National Library of Uganda and to put in place procedures for the collection, preservation, and use of the National Library Collections.


The National Library of Uganda is currently managed and administered by a Director who is appointed by the board, with the approval of the Minister. The Director is the Secretary, Chief Executive, and Accounting Officer of the board.

The Director is also the chief inspector and coordinator of public libraries under local governments on matters relating to library and information services.



7.0 SALIENT OBSERVATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE

- a) The Committee had an interaction with the Director and other staff of National Library of Uganda and analyzed their written memoranda. The National Library of Uganda welcomed the Bill. However, concerns were raised on the repeal of Section 9 of the Principal Act and the saving provisions that relate to staff and payment of terminal benefits. National Library stated that the staff were worried about continuity of National Library operations when the Bill comes into force.
- b) The Committee observed that the National Library of Uganda was established and was under the Committee of Social Services. According to the Certificate of Financial Implication, the Bill is envisaged to result in savings to Government through a reduced wage bill and personnel related costs amounting to **UGX 1.282 bn in FY 2024/25 and UGX 1.622 bn in FY 2025/26.**



- c) The Committee further observed that National Library of Uganda has been a subvention under the Ministry of Gender, Labour and Social Development. The amendment proposes that the management of the National Library and the functions that were performed by it are transferred to the Ministry responsible for education.

The Committee recommends that the National Library of Uganda is mainstreamed into the Ministry of Education and Sports and that terminal benefits of the staff be expeditiously handled.








8.0 CONCLUSION





The Committee on Education and Sports recommends that the Bill be passed.
